Place and length of verge Footpath/Bridleway G10 from its junction with Rectory Lane to the junction with G6. C450m.			
Verge type and orientation. Gently rising wide bridleway with arable land on either side. Bridleway is compacted chalk. Verge on LHS is north facing and on RHS south facing. Very open, no shade and very sunny. Initially both verges are banked, the south facing steeply, but after a short distance they both open up. The north facing verge is narrow with short cut grass the south facing wider and gently sloping towards the sun.
